Program Description

Architecture has two degree programs to choose from.

Our five-year professional degree program in Architecture awards students with a Bachelor of Architecture. The rigorous curriculum will prepare them for taking the architectural registration exam administrated by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (www.ncarb.org (http://www.ncarb.org)), allowing them to become registered architects in any of the fifty states. The B.Arch offers a considerable tuition cost savings over similar M.Arch programs, as it requires about 25 credit hours less over the course of the five years.

Schools of Architecture are granted accreditation by the National Architecture Accreditation Board (www.naab.org (http://www.naab.org)). Because accreditation can only be granted after five years of operation, our program will start as a "candidate for accreditation". Once we have been in operation for five years, our program will be reviewed, and when accreditation is granted, it will apply to all students who have been part of the program since its inception. We are currently in the process of applying for candidacy.

Our curriculum is centered around the Design Studio, which takes place every semester and simulates what life in a professional office will eventually be like. Our other courses are intended to support the Design Studio, teaching students about architectural history, building structure and construction, environmental systems and architectural theory. Additionally, we offer opportunities for internships and study abroad.

We are excited to offer this degree program on the UMKC campus, in the heart of Kansas City, allowing our students to engage with over 200 architecture firms and take advantage of all the lessons a major metropolitan area has to give. Our goal is to use the city as a "learning lab", creating an engaging experience few other architecture programs can offer.

The second degree program, Architectural Studies, leads to a degree in one of the following professional areas: landscape architecture, interior architecture or industrial design. This track is a one-year program, offered in conjunction with Kansas State University's College of Architecture, Planning and Design. Students will then transfer to KSU in Manhattan, KS to complete their degree, and graduate from KSU.

Financial Aid

Many scholarships and student financial aid opportunities are available. Every year approximately 80 percent of our students have some form of scholarship.
