Student Learning Outcomes

Students graduating from this program will:

- Examine the role of Latinos and the Latino Diaspora in U.S. society and the growing role of the transnationalism of Latino immigrants going to and from the U.S. to Mexico, Central American and the Caribbean.
- Acquire an understanding of the experiences, contributions and condition of Latinos in the formation of U.S. society and culture.
- Employ Latina/Latino Studies theories and approaches as essential tools to understand and assess the human experience.
- Critically analyze and communicate an awareness of culture and diversity in our global world.
- Examine and evaluate the breadth and depth of the growing diversity represented within the Latino experience in the U.S.

The minor in Latina/Latino Studies is comprised of 18 hours. Nine (9) credit hours must be in upper division (300 or 400) level courses. A minimum of nine (9) of the 18 hours are required in Latina/Latino Studies.
