<sup>2</sup> Concurrent enrollment in (APPLIED INSTRUMENT) 5300 is required for each semester of enrollment in (APPLIED INSTRUMENT) 5501 and CONSVTY 5597.

<sup>3</sup> A graded half recital during the second semester of study on instruments #2 and #3 is required.

<sup>4</sup> Enroll in pedagogy on four different instruments.

<sup>5</sup> Two semesters or participation in a major ensemble are required on instrument #1. One semester of ensemble participation each is required on instruments #2 and #3.

**Note:** Jury approval of the 101(2) applied level or higher on instruments #4 and #5 is required before graduation.
