Undergraduate research opportunities are available in many disciplines within the School of Humanities and Social Sciences (SHSS). Interested students should speak with faculty members in their major department. When selecting a faculty mentor for undergraduate research, students should consider their own research or creative project ideas, courses they have taken, as well as faculty research interests.

Pre-Law

SHSS offers a variety of majors and programs that serve many pre-law students. SHSS provides classes, faculty mentors, and an academic community to assist students at every step of their pre-law education. This includes identifying skills necessary for success in law school and in the profession, matching students with programs to develop and hone those skills, working with students on choosing a law school and navigating the admissions process, preparing for the LSAT, hosting guest speakers from the legal profession, and opportunities to engage with law school students, faculty, and classes.

90+ Program (Law)

The 90+ opportunity makes it possible for high-achieving students to begin study at UMKC's School of Law after completing 90 undergraduate credit hours. Students then complete their undergraduate degree with law school credits.

The 90+ program **does not** guarantee admission into UMKC's School of Law. Participants must apply and otherwise qualify for law school.

- Any interested student should meet early and often with their academic advisor and MAP Mentor in their major program. All candidates for this program must, during the Law School application process, complete a satisfactory interview with the UMKC School of Law Admissions Committee. Candidates must also demonstrate potential to be a successful law student and an absence of disqualifying character or fitness issues.

Degree Requirements for the School of Humanities and Social Sciences

Junior/Senior-level Writing Intensive Course.

Upper-level (300/400 level) Writing Intensive courses are designated with WI, PW or LW following the course number.

Physical Education (PE) Credit

A maximum of 3 hours of one-credit activity courses in physical education may be applied toward the 120 credit-hour degree minimum.
